Schedule of Confessions:

Confessions are at 3:00 p.m. on Saturdays or by appointment. Please watch the bulletin or website for our Communal Penance Services during Advent and Lent.

Parish Membership:

We are happy to welcome new parishioners to Gesu. You are asked to register at the Parish Office at your earliest convenience. Please notify the Parish Office of any address, phone, or email changes. If you are moving, or if your adult children have moved away from your home, we ask that you notify the Parish Office. If your child is 23 or older, please have them contact the Parish Office to register as an adult.

Baptisms:

Baptisms are celebrated during scheduled weekend Masses or at 12:45 p.m. on a scheduled Sunday each month. Baptism instruction is necessary with the first child. For making arrangements or for more information, please call the Parish Office.

Marriage:

Please contact one of the Gesu Priests at the Parish Office at least six months in advance to arrange the Marriage Preparation Program and date for church use.

Sick Calls:

If you are or a member of your family is ill, in the hospital, or homebound, you may call the Parish Office day or night for Anointing of the Sick. If you would like to have a Eucharistic Visitor or Priest bring Communion to you or a family member, the Parish Office staff will be happy to make arrangements for you.

Funerals:

Please contact the Parish Office as soon as possible. Arrangements must be made by the family and Funeral Director with a Priest before publication in the newspaper. Death notices of Gesu parishioners and family members with links to full obituaries can be found on www.churchofthegesu.org.

Parish Leadership

In September of 2012, Gesu Parish embarked on a major undertaking with the help and guidance of Father Tom Sweetser, SJ, of the *Parish Effectiveness Project* to evaluate our parish, its leadership and many projects, activities and ministries.

Through the use of a survey and hundreds of conversations with parish leaders and parishioners, we worked together to form a new model of “being parish” ensuring the inclusion of parishioners, good communications, and structures that foster good decision-making on all levels.

The Parish Assessment and Renewal Process helped us to design a working model involving the Parish Pastoral Council, the Commissions and the parish staff. The Commissions meet monthly for a common Leadership Night where the best of insights and ideas might find their way into the life of the parish. Each Commission is represented on the Pastoral Council that meets periodically throughout the year. This faith-filled leadership body, guided by the Holy Spirit and the Gospel, works in conjunction with the pastor and parish staff to discern the needs of the parish, as well as guide the parish in building a strong Catholic faith community.

The role of the Pastoral Council is to:

- Mission** Explore the core values and essentials of the parish as a whole, articulate them, and use them to guide and direct the parish.
- Vision** Work together to help form a vision rooted in our Mission Statement, aware of the growing needs of our parish, the surrounding demographic area, and our neighboring parishes and institutions.
- Focus** This council strives to provide a common direction and a focus for the parish as a whole, and for the five Commissions (Worship, Faith Formation, Outreach, Community Life, and Administration) in their respective ministries and activities.

The role of each Commission is:

- Link** To connect with each organization or ministry associated with its area.
- Assess** To evaluate what is going on and hold individuals and groups accountable for what they said they would do.
- Vision** To dream what could happen in their area of ministry and to set goals for the future.
- Funnel** To set up ministry groups to accomplish the goals. (Form the group, give it a job description and timeline to follow, as well as providing support and encouragement for its task.)

Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council is one important component of our parish leadership. It is aligned with the five Commissions, looking with a strategic lens at the present and future of the parish, and identifying themes or directions around which to build goals and programming. In its role as consultative to the pastor, the Council also addresses concerns and needs of the whole parish community.

MINISTRIES

Altar Servers

Altar servers are young people in the sixth, seventh and eighth grades who assist at Masses, weddings and funerals. Servers are encouraged to extend their ministry into their high school years. Contact Hilda Walter at hwalter@churchofthegesu.org for more information.

Art and Environment Committee

Eucharistic Ministers

Eucharistic Ministers assist in the distribution of Communion at weekend Liturgies, and are available for other liturgical events throughout the year. They serve on a regular schedule particularly at the Mass they usually attend. Diocesan training is required. The ministry is open to adults and seniors in high school. Eucharistic Visitors (also see Outreach Commission)

Adults (men and women) assist at funerals in setting up, providing support for families and friends on arrival, and being available to the priests and younger servers during the funeral Mass. Lectors

Magis Ensemble

Serving as the cornerstone of our music ministry, the Magis Ensemble serves at our 10:00 a.m. Sunday morning liturgy. In addition, this group is also present for all major liturgies in the parish throughout the Church year. Magis Ensemble is made up of choral singers and executes repertoire that represents the broad spectrum of sacred music in the Catholic tradition. Along with choral pieces, the vast amount of music sung by the Magis Ensemble is the song of the assembly. Rehearsals take place approximately one Wednesday evening per month, as well as Saturday mornings from 9:00-10:00 a.m. Singers of all (or any) experience are welcome!

Loyola Chamber Orchestra

The Loyola Chamber Orchestra is a group of professional, Cleveland-based musicians who elevate the liturgical experience of feasts and special liturgies in our parish throughout the year. The whole group, which represents instruments of the brass, string, woodwind, and percussion families plays four times a year (Christ the King, Christmas Eve, Easter Vigil, Pentecost). Several other liturgies will include smaller ensembles derived from the Loyola Chamber Orchestra.

Bell Choir

Our Bell Choir “rings” periodically throughout the year. Rehearsals are scheduled only to prepare for the coming Mass where bells will be used. Anyone is welcome to be on our roster, regular availability not required.

School Liturgy Choir

Made up of members of our day school. The School Liturgy Choir sings at school Masses on Friday mornings and periodically on Sundays.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR PRAYER

Children's Liturgy of the Word

CLOW is an opportunity for young children (ages 4 through 9) to hear the Word of God at their own level of understanding. This is offered during the Liturgy of the Word at selected Masses on the weekend. An adult leads the session during the Liturgy of the Word, and children return to their parents at the time of the preparation of the altar and presentation of gifts. Adoration, Eucharistic Exposition & Benediction

On the first and third Friday of the month from 1:00-5:00 p.m. in the Marian Chapel, the parish offers the opportunity for all to pray before the Blessed Sacrament, a devotion rooted in the Eucharist, the source and summit toward which all is directed and from which all flows.(CSL #10). The devotion begins with the Exposition of the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament on the altar, time for individual prayer and meditation, and concludes with Benediction, a blessing of the congregation with the Blessed Sacrament. "When we gather to pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, especially when it is exposed in a monstrance, we engage in a liturgical act which flows from the Mass. A person may feel in these moments of prayer before the Eucharist that he or she is alone – that it is his or her private time with the Lord. However, our prayer in these moments is always in solidarity with the Church: the people of God and the communion of saints. The liturgical document that guides our prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass (HC, issued in 1973) affirms this by stating that there must always be at least two people praying in the presence of the exposed Blessed Sacrament. This is partly because Jesus said in the scriptures, "where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I." Additionally, Jesus always sent his disciples out to mission in pairs, and part of our mission is to be people of prayer." Charismatic Prayer Group

This group meets on Monday evenings from 7:30-9:00 p.m. in the servers' sacristy of the church. It's purpose is to give praise to God through song, prayer and scriptural reflection based on the teachings and traditions of the Church. Contact Pete Cicotti at (216) 932-0198 for more information.

Rosary (also see Outreach Commission)

The recitation of the Rosary takes place in the church or Marian Chapel. The Rosary is prayed on Wednesdays at 7:15 a.m.; the Pink Posse Healing Rosary group (a breast cancer support group) prays on the first Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m., all in the Marian Chapel. Be sure to consult the weekly bulletin for this schedule.

Taize Prayer

Ignatian Identity

The Ignatian Identity Committee exists to explore ways of supporting the spirituality of St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Jesuit religious order. Saint Ignatius was the founder of the Jesuits, or Society of Jesus, which is the order of Catholic priests that has served Gesu Parish since its founding. This committee assists parishioners in deepening their understanding of Ignatian spirituality and fostering their spiritual growth through Ignatian practices.

Ignatian Prayer and Faith Sharing

Once every month, there is a gathering for prayer in the Ignatian traditions of imaginative *Gospel contemplation*, *Lectio Divina*, and the *Examen*. A facilitator guides participants in prayer and reflection with a focus on Sacred Scriptures for the coming Sunday. Watch the bulletin and eNewsletter for dates. Ignatian Retreats

This is a prayer experience based on the Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius of Loyola, and adapted to meet the needs of one's daily life commitments. Novena of Grace

This is an annual nine-day period of prayer to honor the anniversary of the canonizations of Saints Francis Xavier and Ignatius of Loyola (1622).
